This project will allow all students to explore an experiment with typography using a hands-on printing process.

There has been interest in having a better understanding of what the letterpress is, historically, and how it works to create content for the masses. Students in English, art, and design have enjoyed the opportunity to work with moving type to create images and printed work like poetry booklets, zines, and small publications.

Name of Position: Research & Media Assistant

Position Description: This position supports RISCC-ACT (Risks, Impacts, & Strategies for Coastal Communities: Accelerating Action through Translation), an NSF-funded Seed Translational Research Project led by Jon Cox at the University of Delaware that translates NSF-supported coastal resilience research into accessible public programming through documentary film, traveling exhibitions, Photovoice workshops, educational materials, and community conversations with scientists, educators, artists, and local leaders in Delaware, Rhode Island, and South Carolina. The undergraduate researcher will contribute directly to the project's Delaware-based activities, including co-facilitating Photovoice workshops with community members, assisting with documentary film and exhibition production, helping develop materials for the RISCC-ACT Toolkit (curricula, workshop protocols, and facilitation guides), and supporting evaluation of participants' climate-risk understanding, trust in science, and sense of agency. This work directly advances the 2026 Delaware Science and Technology Plan's identification of BlueTech Innovation as an emerging growth opportunity, particularly its emphasis on coastal resilience, environmental monitoring, public-sector engagement, and workforce development, while giving students hands-on training in research translation, science communication, and community-engaged scholarship.

Preferred Qualifications: No prior research experience or specific coursework is required. Students with interest or experience in any of the following are welcome but not required to apply: photography, video, or visual storytelling; environmental science or coastal/climate studies; graphic design or exhibition development; education, outreach, or community engagement; or qualitative research and evaluation methods.

Chemistry

Name of Position: Researcher

Position Description: The Rozovsky Lab in the Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry at the University of Delaware is seeking a student to assist with mammalian cell culture. The student will help maintain mammalian cell lines and support ongoing research projects. Responsibilities may include culturing and passaging cells, preparing media and reagents, assisting with transfections or other cell-based assays, maintaining accurate records, and helping with general lab organization.

Preferred Qualifications: Prior experience with mammalian cell culture is required, as the position will involve regular work with cultured mammalian cells. The ideal candidate is reliable, organized, careful with sterile technique, and able to work independently after training.

Name of Position: Investigation of the Earth's Mantle

Position Description: Student will join the Mantle Processes Group to work on a project using field samples of mantle rocks to study the interior of the Earth. Research projects will explore questions such as: (1) What do sample microstructures indicate about fault-zone deformation? (2) How does sample petrography constrain hydrothermal alteration? (3) What extent of prior melting is indicated by the rock's chemical composition?

Preferred Qualifications: Student needs to have taken GEOL302 (Petrology) so that they have experience with the identification and interpretation of minerals in hand samples and thin section. Student needs prior experience with Excel for organizing and plotting data.

Name of Position: Education Undergraduate Research Assistant

Position Description: Dr. Esboldt is seeking an undergraduate research assistant to join two qualitative studies of teacher learning. The first examines how teacher candidates come to understand ideas of equity across their coursework and field placements. The second follows how K-12 teachers make sense of and respond to immigration enforcement in their schools and communities. The student-scholar in this role will be mentored across the research process, with work that may include assembling and maintaining an archive of public documents and testimony, preparing and verifying interview and focus group transcripts, coding qualitative data, locating and annotating scholarly literature, organizing survey and participant records, documenting research team meetings, and contributing to conference proposals. Depending on timing and interest, there may also be opportunities to sit in on data collection. Most tasks are completed remotely. Students interested in continuing through summer 2027 are preferred.

The Economic Promise of Agrivoltaics in the Caribbean

Principle Investigator: Dr. Lindsay Naylor, lnaylor@udel.edu

Data collection needed!

Job Description: Work with qualitative researchers to conduct secondary data collection about current energy and economic imbalances in the Caribbean, with a focus on Puerto

Rico and Jamaica. This data collection will consist of reading policy, planning, and scholarly documents about solar energy, hurricane preparedness, and economic development.

This is a new project and an opportunity to learn more about the green energy transition, response to natural disasters and solar energy in Puerto Rico and Jamaica, with a focus on the use of solar in farming systems. Although the operation and use stage of renewable energy technologies like wind and solar are highly visible the application across places is uneven. To meet the goal to advance understandings of uneven economic development in these contexts, we will use mixed qualitative methods to examine how power relations, values, and structural inequalities get built into energy decisions and energy transitions, and we look to apply and further develop related analytical tools to help inform future just transition decision making.

Training: Students will need to be certified by CITI in ethics in research with human subjects—this training will be part of the UDRAW position.
